



How would you like to see the Republican Party of Texas, the State's dominant political party, officially call for a vote on Texas independence?

“The Republican Party of Texas urges the Texas Legislature to pass a bill in its next session requiring a referendum in the 2023 general election for the people of Texas to decide on whether or not the State of Texas should reassert its status as an independent nation.”

To make this happen, we need a significant number of voters across Texas to participate in Republican Party Conventions to vote in favor of passing this resolution until it eventually becomes a part of the platform adopted by the State Convention.

How a Resolution Becomes a Plank on the Party Platform

1. Attend your Precinct Convention on March 1, 2022 after polls close.
 - Bring a resolution supporting this new platform plank and convince a majority of the other attendees to vote in favor of recommending it (1 to 20 votes needed).
 - Get elected a delegate to the County Convention, or elect others who will represent your views.
2. Prior to your County Convention, attend Platform Committee meetings and speak in favor of the Committee recommending this resolution to the full Convention (5-15 member committee).
3. Attend your County Convention on March 19, 2022 (or other date specified by the County/SD).
 - Speak in favor of this new platform plank and convince a majority of the other delegates to vote in favor of recommending it (around 10 to 100 votes needed).
 - Get elected a delegate to the State Convention, or elect others who will support Texas independence.
4. Prior to the State Convention, attend Platform Committee meetings (June 13-15) and speak in favor of the Committee recommending this plank to the full Convention (32 member committee).
5. Attend the State Convention June 16 – 18, 2022.
 - Speak in favor of this new platform plank and convince a majority of the other delegates to vote in favor of adopting it as a plank on the 2022 Party Platform (around 4,500 votes needed).
 - Elect members to the State Republican Executive Committee who will support the right of Texans to vote on independence.

Resolution For A Referendum On Texas Independence

WHEREAS, The Republic of Texas existed as an independent nation for nine years, and when it accepted admission to the Union in 1845, it remained a free and independent state subject only to the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, The United States Congress has passed laws requiring Texas to make expenditures that are unfunded by the federal government, which is a violation of the Tenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution; moreover, the federal government has caused the intentional devaluation of its currency through its reckless spending and borrowing, and this threatens the economic stability of Texas; and

WHEREAS, The United States government has allowed the use of its authority, credit, and goodwill for the benefit of private and foreign concerns in violation of its own constitution; in addition, its repeated failure to guard the border between Texas and Mexico has forced the state to spend vast sums in order to protect its citizens; and

WHEREAS, The federal government has further implemented thousands of laws, mandates, and agencies in violation of the United States Constitution and of the sovereignty of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Section 1, Article I, Texas Constitution, states that "the perpetuity of the Union depend[s] upon the preservation of the right of local self-government, unimpaired to all the States"; Section 2, Article I, declares, "All political power is inherent in the people, and all free governments are founded on their authority, and instituted for their benefit. The faith of the people of Texas stands pledged to the preservation of a republican form of government, and, subject to this limitation only, they have at all times the inalienable right to alter, reform or abolish their government in such manner as they may think expedient"; now,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party of Texas urges the Texas Legislature to pass a bill in its next session requiring a referendum in the 2023 general election for the people of Texas to decide on whether or not the State of Texas should reassert its status as an independent nation.
